Winter's just begun. Here's what "winter-ready" should look like at your home:

Close outside vents, crawl spaces and doors so cold doesn't seep inside and freeze water pipes.

Identify and insulate water pipes that may be at risk of freezing.

Going away? Keep minimum heat on inside. Open bathroom/kitchen cabinets to expose pipes to warmer air. Let cold water drip from faucets served by exposed pipes.

Make sure everyone in the household knows where the water shut-off valve is in case of emergency.

Increased water storage and safety are goals for retrofitting Magalia Dam



Geologists and engineering professionals are working with PID to explore retrofit options for Magalia Dam.
After the best option is

identified, PID will begin to seek funding sources to retrofit the 100+ year-old dam. In 1997, the California Division of Safety of Dams (DSOD) determined the risk of an earthquake causing problems for the dirt-formed dam was too high to allow PID to use the reservoir's full capacity; since that time, Magalia Reservoir has only been allowed to store one-third of its capacity.

"Our dam is currently safe to hold the amount of water we have in it," notes Bill Taylor, Treatment Plant Superintendent. "But our community would definitely benefit from the higher level of storage; while we're lucky to have an active watershed, at the best we have less than three years' water capacity with the limited storage in Magalia Reservoir. More water storage is better, especially during drought times."

"We're working with Slate Geotechnical to develop all the details needed to create a 'shovel-ready' project which can then be submitted for different funding options," adds Blaine Allen, District Engineer.

Cost for the first two phases (checking for project feasibility and now developing a shovel-ready plan) was covered through a FEMA Hazard Mitigation Crant.
