PID providing 5-gallon water jugs to Paradise residents thanks to the North Valley Community Foundation & The Butte Strong Fund

PID customers residing in Paradise will be the first to receive a free 5-gallon water storage container thanks to the North Valley Community Foundation & the Butte Strong Fund. The district, supported by the Paradise Hope Center applied for the \$25,500 grant to benefit those customers living in Paradise who may still be using alternative water sources for drinking and cooking. The 5-gallon plastic jugs are reusable and can be used to store drinking water for daily use or as part of a home emergency preparedness kit. The district hopes residents will enjoy the jugs as an alternative to using bottled water. Recipients are provided instructions on how to properly clean the container before use. After the jug has been properly washed and disinfected, customers can fill at the PID office on Clark Road or the treatment plant at 13888 Pineneedle Drive in Magalia.

Current Paradise residents can pick up their jug at the District office located at 6332 Clark Road in Paradise. Recipients will be required to show proof of residency such as utility bill (PG&E, PID, NRWS, Cellular). Jugs will be distributed exclusively to these Paradise residents on a first-come, first-serve basis until April 30th. After this reservation period, the District will offer remaining jugs to residents of Butte County affected by the Camp Fire. A total of 2,600 water jugs will be distributed through this free program.





District begins work to update its strategic plan

The Paradise Irrigation District Board of Directors will soon start a strategic planning process to map out the future priorities of the District. The District developed its last strategic plan in 2012. Since then, Paradise, the District, and our customers have experienced significant change, namely the 2018 Camp Fire. We've completed water testing for all standing homes & businesses



We've completed testing for firerelated volatile organic compounds (VOCs) of more than 1500 service laterals to standing homes and businesses in Paradise.

This testing project began in May 2019 to ensure our customers receive water that meets or exceeds California drinking water standards. Through this process we found 26 locations where water tested outside of these standards. To correct the issues we replace the service lateral with brand new pipe. All 26 repairs will be complete this month.

All customers in standing homes or businesses should receive the letter lifting their water advisory by March 30th. Please contact the District if you do not receive this letter.
